### **Poster Contest**


- Posters should promote the Fire Prevention Week theme, and encourage fire safety awareness in the home, school and community.
- 2. Posters must be drawn on an 8 ½ by 11 inch letter-sized white paper.
- 3. Student's name, school, grade and teacher's name must be on the back of the poster.
- 4. One (1) entry per student.
- 5. Posters are to be completed by students, without assistance.
- Only hand-drawn entries will be accepted (no computer-generated imaging).
- A panel of judges will select the winning posters based on originality, clarity of message, design and ageappropriate skill. The decision of the judges is final.

### **2** Home Fire Escape Plan

- 1. Students will take home the NFPA How to Make a Home Fire Escape Plan worksheet. (Teachers should contact their fire department if they need help with printing copies of the worksheet.) Worksheet can be found at sparkyschoolhouse.org (scroll down to find Fire Prevention Week resources).
  - 2. Students will fill out the worksheet with a parent or guardian.
  - 3. Every student that brings the worksheet back to school, with the Home Fire Escape Plan filled in, will be entered to win a prize.
  - 4. Teachers may submit the worksheets, or a list of names of students that submitted a worksheet.

Three winners (1st, 2nd and 3rd place) will be chosen from each grade level. One grand prize winner for the Poster Contest, and one for the Home Escape Plan Challenge will receive –\$100 for their elementary school, a pizza party for their class and a small prize for themselves. The winning poster will be used in promotional material where appropriate.

All winners will be honored at an awards ceremony where refreshments will be served at Shriners Hospitals for Children, attended by their parents, teachers, principals and local fire officials at 5:00pm on Friday, December 8, 2017.



- ☐ Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- All windows and doors should open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- Pick a meeting place outside. It should be in front of your home. Everyone will meet at the meeting place.
- Make sure your house or building number can be seen from the street.
- ☐ Talk about your plan with everyone in your home.
- Learn the emergency phone number for your fire department.
- Practice your home fire drill!
- Make your own home fire escape plan using the grid provided on page 2.




# How to make a Home Fire Escape Plan



Memorize your fire department's emergency phone number and write it below:



- Draw a floor plan or a map of your home. Show all **doors** and **windows**.
- Mark two ways out of each room.
- Mark all of the **smoke alarms** with SA. Smoke alarms should be in each sleeping room, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home.
- Pick a family **meeting place** outside where everyone can meet.
- Remember, practice your plan at least twice a year!



**Grown-ups:** Children don't always wake up when the smoke alarm sounds. Know what your child will do before a fire occurs.
